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

# The SCM requires a shared vision of the outcomes for each degree completion



that leverages both ADN and BSN curricula to achieve a unified approach with



#### **SCM Hallmarks**



- No duplication of, or confusion about, the specific community college and university general education, nursing prerequisites, and nursing requirements for each degree
- No duplication or addition of required nursing prerequisites to the curriculum for ADN-BSN progression
- No [inadvertent] repetition of nursing content to meet licensure requirements in the curriculum for ADN-BSN progression

#### So, what's the problem?



Lack of consistency in nursing prerequisites and general education requirements

No uniformity in how, or if, the student of nursing is advised as a transfer

CC nursing graduate accumulates non-transferrable units

CC graduation requirements may not be transparent



Community College	Year 1	LDGE and Nursing Prerequisites	Overlaps especially in sciences and behavioral sciences	30 units
	Year 2	Nursing	Curriculum required for licensure and LDGE	30 units
	Year 3	Nursing	Curriculum required for licensure and LDGE	30 units
University	Year 4	UDGE and Nursing	Unique BSN content (not curriculum for licensure) and UDGE	30 units
