



# What are the obstacles to seamless ADN-BSN Progression?







### The ADN-BSN Unit Conundrum

ADN-BSN Student's Unit Accumulation	Purpose
82-92 u	To meet all ADN GE, nursing prerequisite and nursing major requirements
+ 16 u	Outstanding GE (not met with above) required for transfer and to meet U GE requirements
98-108 u TOTAL	Only 70 of these units are allowed to count toward the 120 u for BSN
50 units	Required to be taken at university to reach 120 u BSN requirement
148-158 units TOTAL	Minimum actual units eventually completed by ADN-BSN to achieve the BSN vs 120 units for Pre-Licensure BSN


