## Learning Collaborative Teleconference on a Curriculum of a Culture of Health Summary

More than 20 people took part in a discussion that began with Regina (Gina) H. Johnson, MSN, RN, clinical instructor faculty at the University of Kansas School of Nursing, talking about <u>"The Preparation of Community/Public Health Nurses: Amplifying the Impact,"</u> a paper that she and colleagues from the University of Colorado at Colorado Springs, University of Pennsylvania, and University of Toledo published in *Public Health Nursing*.

- how people are defining "social determinants of health"
- the importance of global health
- precision population
