- Established in 1997; Opened in May 1997
- Jointly owned:
 - Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC), SouthCentral Foundation (SCF), tribal governments, & regional health organizations
- · Non-profit; Provides medical services to 158,000 AN/AI
- 182 bed facility
- Alaska's first Level II Trauma Center
- Level II Pediatric Trauma Center
- Close Partnership with other rural health facilities statewide to support broad range of health care & related services

VISION OF PARTNERSHIP:

ALASKA NATIVE MEDICAL CENTER AND ALASKA PACIFIC UNIVERSITY

- To address the nursing shortage
- To fill open nursing positions within organization
- To educate, train, and mentor student nurses in the setting they will be employed (decrease amount of time for orientation)
- To foster relationships and immerse student nurses in cultural safety
- To encourage and provide opportunity for practicing RNs to mentor











ALASKA NATIVE MEDICAL CENTER

Dr. Mary Martin, Clinical Liaison

- •Developed in fall of 2019 to assist with filling the gaps of the nursing shortage.
- •Developed for the partnership with APU to allow the nursing students to complete all clinical rotations at ANMC.
- •ANMC nurses staffed the clinical instructor roles for the nursing students.
- •ANMC nurses would become clinical adjunct instructors.
- •APU nursing students completed all their clinical rotations @ ANMC.

THE APU PARTERSHIP MODEL



All Partnerships

APU provides faculty education, simulation support, curriculum, travel, student support services and data

Partner provides student clinical placements, adjunct clinical faculty, preceptors, and liaison. Partners outside of Anchorage also provide lab space, housing for visiting faculty when available, etc.

APU employer sponsorship agreements, employer workstudy agreements, tuition reimbursement through HR/Employee Benefits, grant funding, Tribal Health System scholarships, etc.





PARTNERSHIPS

The Key to Success: Reimagining the Model





Instead of nursing education being siloed away from the healthcare industry, we work directly with our partners. We share resources to provide in-place nursing education throughout the state.

Full-time faculty work with adjunct clinical faculty at the facilities, building an instructional team.



Students located in rural sites throughout the state study at the healthcare facility.



Faculty from APU visit sites at least two times per semester for standardized highlevel simulations to evaluate student learning.
